

Scientific Research Summer 2022 in the UACJ



CANDIDATES

This program is for undergraduate and graduate students of post-secondary international institutions who want to complete a summer research program in 2022.

PERIOD

From six to nine weeks stay between May and August, with previously acknowledged dates by the academic researcher who published your acceptance letter.

OBJECTIVES

Boost the continuing education of students through international research stays.

Promote the student's academic, professional, cultural, and personal traits, as well as their interest in scientific activities in various fields of study.

Strengthen the knowledge, abilities, and values of the next generation of professionals.

Practice social inclusion and regional equity between participants.

ELIGIBILITY

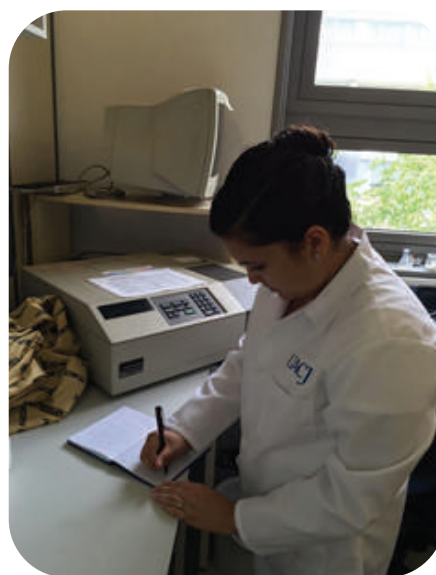
Undergraduate students:

- Minimum percentage grade of 80.
- Have concluded the early stage of your major.
- Be accepted by an academic researcher of the UACJ.
- If you are accepted in a project in English, you must demonstrate an English proficiency of at least level B1 (only for students that English is not their first language)
- If your first language is not Spanish, and you are accepted in a project in Spanish, you must demonstrate a Spanish proficiency of at least level B1.



Graduate students:

- Minimum percentage grade of 80.
- Have concluded the early stage of your major.
- Be accepted by an academic researcher of the UACJ.
- If you are accepted in a project in English, you must demonstrate an English proficiency of at least level B1 (only for students that English is not their first language)
- If your first language is not Spanish, and you are accepted in a project in Spanish, you must demonstrate a Spanish proficiency of at least level B1.



REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

1. Application form filled in a computer; must include a photograph of the applicant.

2. Application letter addressed to the Deputy Director of the Cooperation and International Office M. Yadira I. Márquez González, signed by the Exchange office of your institution.
3. Acceptation letter by a UACJ academic researcher.
4. Academic record.
5. Copy of valid passport
6. Statement of purpose; include the academic motive of your interest in the program.
7. Curriculum Vitae (two pages long; without supporting documentation).
8. Recommendation letter by an academic of your institution.
9. Proof of Spanish Language Proficiency of at least level B1 (If Spanish is not your first language and the project you applied to is in Spanish).
10. Proof of English Language Proficiency of at least level B1 (If English is not your first)



APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Look for a project of your interest in the Participating Academic Researchers catalog.
2. Contact the academic researcher to request your participation in the project and an acceptance letter.
3. Once you have received the acceptance letter, contact your University International Office for the postulation.
4. Prepare the Required Documents based on the previous section.
5. Wait for the publication of results.



SPECIFICATIONS

- The program is under mandatory compliance with health regulations and measures issued by the authorities and may undergo changes that will be communicated promptly.
- The number of accepted students will be established by the receiving academic researcher.
- 6 to 9 weeks stay between May to August, with prior agreement with the receiving academic researcher.
- Tuition, School ID, and certificate dispatch are covered by the UACJ.
- Students applying to the program must be enrolled in their home institution, at the time of applying to the UACJ program.
- If your first language is English, and you are applying to a project conducted in English, you should not demonstrate your English proficiency.
- If your first language is Spanish, and you are applying to a project conducted in Spanish, you should not demonstrate your Spanish proficiency.

PROGRAM FEES

The program does not have any cost. The students must be responsible for their living expenses.

Approximate monthly living expenses

Living expenses	Approximate monthly costs
Housing, rent or hotel	6,000 – 30,200 mexican pesos per person (refer to the housing options directory)
Food	2,000 – 4,000 mexican pesos per person (buying in a supermarket) Restaurants (refer to the Visiting student’s guide for recommendations)
Public transportation	960 mexican pesos per person (public transportation) For private transportation through platforms, the prices vary according to the distance (refer to the Visiting student’s guide)

Arrival protocol of Exchange students to the UACJ

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the UACJ has implemented an arrival protocol for Exchange students. This protocol intends to maintain your health. Once you have been accepted, the information on this protocol will be delivered to you.

Student temporary residence in Mexico

International students can stay 180 days in Mexican territory. It is necessary to meet the incoming and outgoing dates since your arrival in Mexico.
